## Somerset Regional Council – Dog and Cat Registration Fees 1 July 2009 to 30 June 2010

### Dog Registration fees

Where paid on or before 30 September 2009 or where new dog between 30 September 2009 and 31 December 2009:

>> Entire dogs over 6 months of age (male or female) - 1 July to 30 June in the following year	54.00
>> De-sexed dogs - over 6 months of age - 1 July to 30 June in the following year	26.00
>> Dogs over 3 months but less than 6 months of age when first registered - 1 July to 30 June in the following year	26.00
>> Pensioner discount for persons who hold a pensioner concession card at date of registration - 50% - 1 July to 30 June in the following year	50%

\*\*\*\*Where paid after 30 September 2009:

>> Entire dogs over 6 months of age (male or female) - 1 July to 30 June in the following year	83.00
>> De-sexed dogs - over 6 months of age - 1 July to 30 June in the following year	47.00
>> Dogs over 3 months but less than 6 months of age when first registered - 1 July to 30 June in the following year	26.00
>> Pensioner discount for persons who hold a pensioner concession card at date of registration - 50% - 1 July to 30 June in the following year	50%

New residents and new dogs on or after 1 January 2010:

>> Entire dogs over 6 months of age (male or female) - 1 January to 30 June	30.00
>> De-sexed dogs - over 6 months of age - 1 January to 30 June	17.00
>> Dogs over 3 months but less than 6 months of age when first registered - 1 January to 30 June	17.00
>> Pensioner discount for persons who hold a pensioner concession card at the date of registration - 50% - 1 January to 30 June	50%

Exceptions regarding persons relocating with dogs registered in other Local Government areas, working farm dogs and the transfer of registration from dead registered dogs to replacement dogs are as indicated in Council's resolutions of 28 November 2001.

Refunds policy is as set out in Esk Shire Council's resolutions of 28 November 2001.

### Cat Registration fees

Registration applies for the period 1 July 2009 to 30 June 2010

>> Entire cats over 6 months of age (male or female) - 1 July to 30 June in the following year or part thereof	10.00
>> De-sexed cats - over 6 months of age - 1 July to 30 June in the following year or part thereof	8.00
>> Cats over 3 months but less than 6 months of age when first registered - 1 July to 30 June in the following year or part thereof	8.00
>> Pensioner discount for persons who hold a pensioner concession card at date of registration - 50%	50%

**All working dogs residing in a residential area incur full domestic registration obligations.**

## Conditions to abide by Restricted Dog Permit

1. Owner must ensure the dog is de-sexed within 3 months of the restricted dog permit being issued or the dog reaching 6 months of age whichever is later.
2. The dog must be implanted with a Prescribed Permanent Implantation Device (PPID).
3. The dog must, at all times, wear a collar with an attached identifying tag. The tag must be:
  - Made of metal or plastic, and
  - In the shape of a disc; and
  - At least 50mm in diameter; and
  - Engraved with the words "Regulated Dog" and a 24 hour contact telephone number for the owner or responsible person for the dog.
4. The dog must be muzzled in a public place and must be under the effective control of someone who has the control of no more than 1 dog at the same time.
5. An enclosure for the dog must be maintained at or on the address in the registration notice for the dog and must be childproof and stop the dog from leaving the enclosure. The enclosure must:
  - Allow access to the front entrance of the house so that a member of the public seeking access to the front entrance does not have to enter the enclosure
  - Be at least 300m<sup>2</sup> and must not include any area that is a swimming pool or area surrounding a swimming pool
  - Be at least 1m high above ground level if the dog is 8kg or less or be at least 1.8m high above ground level if the dog is more than 8kg
  - Consist of firm and strong materials with walls designed to prevent children from climbing into the enclosure. The walls may include a perimeter fence for the relevant place or an exterior wall of a structure if it complies with all other requirements of the enclosure.
  - Include a weatherproof sheltered area appropriate for the dog
  - Include a gate which must be childproof, self-closing and self-latching; and comply with the requirements for the enclosure and which must not be a vehicle access gate

The enclosure may have another gate that is not self-closing and self-latching if it is not a vehicle gate, complies with requirements for the enclosure and is kept securely locked whenever it is not in immediate use.

6. A sign/notice must be placed at or near each entrance to the enclosure of place where the dog is usually kept notifying the public that a restricted dog is kept there and must:
  - Be 360mm in height and 260mm in width.
  - Consist of firm and strong materials with a black background
  - Contain the following information
    - The sign must contain the following information – 'BEWARE OF THE RESTRICTED DOG'; and the words 'declared under the *Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008*
    - The information on the sign must be in white letters that are 13mm in height, indelible legible and in upper case.
7. The dog must not be usually kept at a place other than the place stated in the registration notice as the address for the dog.
8. If the permit holder obtains another restricted dog permit for the dog subject of the permit, the permit holder must immediately give the local government notice of the other permit.
9. The permit holder must advise the local government of any change in their residential address within 7 days after making the change. If the new residential address is in another local government area, the permit holder must also give notice to the other local government.

## Things to Remember!

- Please check the details on this notice and notify Council of any changes. This can be done by phone or at any Council Office situated at Esk, Lowood or Kilcoy. Your details will then be updated.
- You can receive a 50% reduction in your registration fees if you are the holder of a Pensioner Concession Card or a Veteran Affairs Gold Card.
- Somerset Regional Council has Microchip Readers. If your dog/cat has a microchip and you would like this information recorded, please advise Council at any of the Council offices situated at Esk, Lowood or Kilcoy.
- **Please remember you may incur a \$200.00 on the spot fine for failing to register your dog/s and cat/s.**
- Payment can be made in person at any Council Office, Bpay or mail (tags will be posted when payment is received).
- All dogs/cats after July 1<sup>st</sup> 2009 must not be sold, given away or transferred unless micro chipped. Severe penalties may occur for the owner of the animal and the receiver if the conditions above are breached.
- Working dogs that are housed in a residential area have the same registration laws as per domestic dogs.
