WHAT IS THE REGIONAL ARTS DEVELOPMENT FUND?

The Regional Arts Development Fund (RADF) is a partnership between state and local governments which invests in quality arts and cultural experiences across Queensland based on locally determined priorities.

RADF promotes the role and value of arts, culture and heritage as key drivers to support diversity and inclusivity, grow strong regions; and provide training, education and employment opportunities for Queensland artists and local communities.

The RADF program heralds the beginning of a more flexible and innovative approach to supporting arts and culture in Somerset.

The first stage of the RADF application process involves the submission of a two-page project outline and budget. Consider the following:

- What is the project?
- Who is involved?
- Partnerships?
- When will the project take place?
- Where will the project take place?
- What will the outcome be?
- How much will the project cost?
- How much funding is required?
- Have you clearly explained how your project aligns with one of Council's strategic themes:
 - 1. Somerset stories
 - 2. Wellbeing
 - 3. Placemaking
 - 4. Person and Places activation program
 - 5. Skills development

READ THE RADF GUIDELINES

- Provide a one-page outline of your idea and a brief summary of its components.
- Complete the basic budget for your project.
- If your project is shortlisted, you will be invited to progress to stage two where you will be required to submit a detailed project application and pitch your idea to the RADF committee.
