Penalty Unit

The fine amount for an offence under Queensland State legislation and the laws of local governments is identified as a penalty unit. Queensland's <u>Penalties and Sentences</u> (<u>Penalty Unit Value</u>) <u>Amendment Regulation 2022</u> defines the dollar value of a penalty unit. This is subject to a yearly review by the State Treasurer.

As of 1 July 2022, the value of a penalty unit is \$143.75.

The <u>Penalties and Sentences Regulation 2015</u> also defines how to calculate the fine amount. The number of penalty units attributed to the offence is multiplied by the value of a penalty unit. The final amount is then rounded down to the nearest whole dollar.

For example:

- a fine of 1 penalty unit is \$143 (rounded down from \$143.75)
- a fine of 2 penalty units is \$287 (rounded down from \$287.50).

Some councils choose not to increase the penalty unit value for fines related to their local laws and it remains at \$75. These councils are listed in Schedule 2 of the *Penalties and Sentences Regulation 2015*.
