Part 1 Preliminary

1 Short title

This local law may be cited as Somerset Regional Council Gates and Grids (Application of Continuing Local Law) Local Law 2011.

Part 2 Application of continuing local law

3 Continuing local law applied

Pursuant to section 13(2) of the Local Government Reform Implementation Regulation 2008, Somerset Regional Council applies Local Law No. 24 (Gates and Grids) of Kilcoy Shire Council to the whole of the local government area of Somerset Regional Council without changes.

4 Local law repealed

- (1) This local law repeals each provision in *Local Law No. 3 (Gates and Grids)* of Esk Shire Council.
- (2) This section expires on the day after notice of the making of the local law is published in the gazette.

5 Transitional provision for repealed local law

- (1) A decision under a repealed local law, that was in force immediately before the commencement of this section, continues in force as if the decision were made under *Local Law No. 24 (Gates and Grids)* of Kilcoy Shire Council.
- (2) A decision includes an agreement, appointment, approval, authorisation, certificate, charge, consent, declaration, delegation, direction, exemption, immunity, instruction, licence, order, permit, plan, release, resolution, and restriction, for example.
